- 2. The following questions are based on the novella Animal Farm by George Orwell.
 - i. Compare and contrast Napoleon and Snowball. (10 marks)
 - ii. Describe the technique used by the author. (5 marks)
 - iii. From whose perspective is Animal Farm told? (5 marks)

- i. Why does Dickens describe the industry in Coketown with animal metaphors in the novel *Hard Times* by Charles Dickens?
 - ii. How is "old family" vs. "new money" depicted in Mrs. Sparsit and Mr. Bounderby?
