## Abstract

After ethnic conflict in the Batticaloa large number of the women have been become widows. They are only response to lead whole family. But the women headed households have inefficient living stand to maintain their quality of life. They have effected totally by poverty because of less income, unemployment, insufficient basic needs such as education, health, food and etc. The main objective of the present study is to explore the reason of the poverty level and increasing the level of quality of live

Data for variables, income, employment, basic needs, social status and family statues were collected through the samples of 100 affected women headed households who were randomly selected from 24 affected GN division's families in Paddipalai DS division. The self-developed was used to collected period between 20<sup>th</sup> of March and 28<sup>th</sup> of Arial. The universate analysis specifically percentage method was made through computer package Excel.

The result of this study reveals women headed households have problem related to all variables. This is the evidence that no one ongoing many upliftment programmes paid attention on community.

It is recommended, that in order to uplift quality of life of women headed households, government and non- government organization and their activities should be mainly focused on women headed households community. In addition to extent this idea further researches are needed.
